If we put that sign in its best light, even brighter than a South Carolina sunrise, we might suggest they're talking about the "new you" that Jesus brings you through being forgiven in Him. Thankfully, after looking around that particular church is actively involved in prayer, Bible study, and missions.


Sometimes we mean well by what we say, but an unintended message is sent. On the other hand, maybe we read too much into things. A pastor mentor of mine used to tell me whatever you say in your sermons, make sure you clearly proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I love that. I've heard plenty of great sermons though which the Spirit moved in my heart, but not all sermons plainly spell out the Good News.

Perhaps we might take the example of that less-than-perfect church sign to our own lives as followers of Christ. We might be quirky, dress differently, or not "from around here". We might have those "foot in your mouth" incidents from time to time. We mean well, but we're human, and that's okay.

What else about you might show people the Good News of Jesus? It's the hot meal you dropped off to your sick neighbor. It's letting the mom with wiggly children in line ahead of you at the grocery store check-out. It's the "How have you been doing?" text to your friend you haven't heard from lately. It's showing up, but more than that, it's showing Jesus.

St. Francis of Assisi said it well: "Preach the Gospel at all times, and, when necessary, use words."
