Why is it Called Ballroom Dancing?

Ballroom vs. Latin Dances. Although commonly classified together, there are notable differences. Ballroom dances are "smooth" like the Waltz, Foxtrot, and Tango while Latin dances are more rhythmic like the Rumba, Samba, Cha Cha, and the Mambo.
