Martin Luther's Humor

We often talk about how great a theologian Martin Luther was. His writings are still the core theology of the Lutheran Church. However, many people do not realize that Luther was one that had many struggles in his life. His relief from those struggles was humor. Whether it was making fun of the pope, the devil, or himself, Luther often had a wittiness that was visible in his writings. Below is a sample of some of the wittiness (with references to the writings). Perhaps laughter can be the best medicine. I give thanks that we are a church that can laugh together, no matter what.

- No one can become an expert among ignoramuses.
- The bird sings according to the size of its beak. (TH 133:121)
- The church is a mouth-house rather than a pen-house. (WA 10 1/2, 48:5)
- The Franciscans are the lice which the devil put into the fur-coat of God. (TT no. 301, 1532. WATR 1, 125:1-2) (Luther did not like the Franciscans.)
- Tomorrow I have to lecture on the drunkenness of Noah, (Gen. 9:20-27) so I should drink enough this evening to be able to talk about that wickedness as one who knows by experience. (TT No. 3476. LW 54:207)

And my favorite:

• Some people need a fig-leaf on their mouths. (TH 105:86)

There is also a website called the <u>Luther Insulter</u>. Feel free to go check it out and be insulted by Luther!

This year for VBS, I will be teaching an adult class using some of Luther's more "salty" writings & exploring the reasons why Luther was this way. Hope you can join us for the adult class of VBS!

Ministry Highlights

Church Council met May 18th @ 4 pm. Attendance: Teresa Ellisor & Larry James were absent.

- Education: met via email. No report.
- Evangelism: Blowfish update—117 tickets sold. Twelve of those are children 12 & under.
- **Property**: Nursery floor has been installed. Outside lights have been repaired. Storage shed has been cleaned up.
- **Safety:** Will provide safety & medical assistance during VBS in the building and in the parking lot.
- Scouts: Last month's propane overage was due to Palmetto Propane billing us twice. The propane company is sending us a check for about \$1,000. Once this check is received, the Scout propane account balance will be \$147.12. Council approved Scouts spending up to the amount currently in their account without further approval from Council as vans are coming available & being sold quickly without time for further approval.
- Service: Raised over \$5,000 for Relay for Life!
 Over \$1,200 raised in food sales during the hour or
 so before the storms. Prepping for Service night at
 Vacation Bible School on Thursday night.
- **Staff Support**: Still working on evaluation form.
- **Stewardship:** Prep complete for annual audit. The Audit will begin June 3rd. Preliminary work being done on 2026 budget.
- Technology: Thanks to Clay's tweaking of the sound system settings, sound quality continues to improve & delay between speakers & Bluetooth transmitter has been significantly reduced.
- Worship & Music: We will provide "breakfast for dinner" again for opening night of VBS. Combined choirs will sing National Anthem & God Bless America for Blowfish game on May 30th.
- Youth: first children's message went well on Mothers' Day. Youth are at Lakeside this afternoon playing BINGO with the residents.

SPECIAL CALLED CONGREGATION MEETING

JUNE 22, 2025 @ 9:45 AM / SANCTUARY

The only business of this meeting is to vote on ratifying the Carolinas Mission Region article 7.02. This change is in regard to the number of lay delegates each congregation may send. Currently the number is based on the number of baptized members of a congregation. The change reflects that every congregation may send two. This will enable all congregations to have an equal voice and vote.

Current Article 7.02

7.02 Delegates with voting privileges at a Convocation of the Carolinas Mission Region, or any Convocation of a member Mission District (see Art. 7.05), shall be the ordained ministers of the Mission Districts that comprise the Carolinas Mission Region of the NALC and the official lay delegates of the congregations of the Mission Districts in the Carolinas. Each congregation of the Carolinas Mission Region of the NALC shall elect one lay delegate to the Convocation for every 400 baptized members, or fraction thereof, of such congregation. In the event that the total number of lay delegates elected pursuant to the preceding sentence is less than the total number of ordained clergy, the Regional Council of the Carolinas Mission Region of the NALC (or, in the case of a specially called Mission District Convocation, the Regional Council representatives of the Mission District in question) shall apportion additional lay delegates based on the relative size of the congregations in the member Mission Districts.

Proposed change to Article 7.02

7.02 Those with voting responsibilities at a Convocation of the Carolinas Mission Region, or any Convocation of a member Mission District, shall be the ordained ministers of the Mission Districts that comprise the Carolinas Mission Region of the NALC and the official lay delegates of the congregations of the Mission Region and Mission Districts. Each congregation may send up to two lay delegates to the annual CMR Convocation and Mission District Convocations. Lay persons chosen by their congregations to represent them at the Convocation are delegates. Clergy and delegates have voice and vote.
