(Psalm 23:4).

And, yes, even young people get that. They experience the great depth of mercy of Christ in powerful ways. I can't wait to hear the stories of our youth when they return from Burnsville, NC. Clay is leading our mission trip this year and I know our youth must be excited to have their youth director with them on this adventure of service.

Please pray for our children & our young people this summer. May we be a congregation of believers who help foster their joy for Jesus.

- Evangelism: Great night at the Blowfish game.
- Property: Repairs have been made to the gas stove in the PLC and the doorknob in the Bride's room. Working to repair a leak in the storage room in the Fellowship Hall. Repair & paving of the parking lot should begin this week (barring rain).
- **Safety:** During VBS, provided safety and medical assistance in the building & in the parking lot.
- Scouts: Purchased a used van from a church in Darlington. The church was very grateful it will finally be used. The van is a 2013 Chevrolet with 47K miles & holds 15 passengers. Thanks to all who helped make this happen!
- Service: Helped with service project at VBS. We packed cat & dog food, packed 50 flood buckets, tied numerous tie knot blankets, and flattened grocery bags for Mission Lexington.
- **Staff Support**: Pastor Judson is beginning work on staff evaluations so Finance will have them before they being working on the 2026 budget.
- **Stewardship:** Audit is underway.
- **Technology:** Paul Schreiber is working on a quote for our electronic sign. It will fit in the same place between the existing stone.
- Worship & Music: Provided "breakfast for dinner" for VBS on the first night. Not having a final count, we had a lot of food leftover.
- Youth: preparations are being made for the Youth Mission Trip to Burnsville, NC. Clay is getting to know the young adults. Some work schedules keep them from attending every Sunday. He is working on other times & activities to get them together.
- Council: voted not to meet in July.


