Proposed By-Law Changes

Cemetery: The cemetery committee recommends revision to by-laws Section Eight, Item 13

Proposed

The Cemetery committee reserves the right to remove from graves dead or faded flowers, unsightly broken or tattered items. Loose items should not be placed in the grass but should be placed on the Monument base. Lighted items are discouraged. Live plants may not be planted within the cemetery boundary. Digging holes for flower pots is prohibited. All flowers should be placed in appropriate containers (no glass). They should be placed in the granite holders or metal pot holders. Wire hooks should be used to anchor free standing flowers to stabilize the container Any seasonal items left over an extended period of time will be removed. A disposal container is


located at the gate for trash you wish to discard.

Current

The cemetery committee reserves the right to remove from graves any flowers or materials which have become unsightly. Live plants, flowers, shrubs, and trees are prohibited from being planted within the boundary of the cemetery.

Please let the Safety Ministry Team know how we can help plan the safety aspects of your church-wide events.



You have a question and you *know* we have someone at church who is in charge of that, but you can't remember who does what. Well, here's a list to help you.

- Pastor Judson & Pastor Cassie: both are here to help with your spiritual needs, spiritual questions, hospital visits, etc. They do all the preaching, teach Wednesday AM Bible Study and they share duties as representatives on all church committees. They are also in and out a lot doing hospital visits and checking on our homebound members. They do not have a crystal ball, so please call when you have surgery approaching or are sick, in the hospital, need communion, or need a visit.
- Clay Morell: Clay's official title is Youth & Young Adults Director (YAYA for short). That puts him in charge of all programming & activities for youth grades 3-12 and young adults ages 18-30.
- **Carol Wyndham:** Her official title is Administrative Coordinator, but she basically handles all of the logistics of the church—Parish Administrator, creator/editor of all written and electronic communication, "Keeper of the Calendar", webmaster, Office Manager. She also coordinates volunteers for worship & the office, does copier repair and orders supplies & literature for all ministries. Carol is in the office Monday-Thursday 9 am-6 pm and 9 am-Noon on Fridays.
- **Valerie Porth:** Valerie is our bookkeeper. She pays all the bills, writes all the checks, and balances the checkbook, & reports to Stewardship/Finance each month. See her with any questions about your giving or any reimbursements you need. She is in the office on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- **Dot Rish:** Dot is our church treasurer. She is in the office on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- Barry Moore: Barry leads Chancel Choir (11 am worship). They rehearse Sundays @ 10:15 am. He also leads Cantata Choir Mondays @ 7:15 pm in the Sanctuary, and Handbells @ 4 pm on Sundays.
- Craig Davis: Craig leads Matins Choir (8:30 am). They rehearse on Mondays @ 6:30 pm.
- Kayla Ellingson: Kayla leads our preschool choirs on Sunday mornings @ 10 am.
- Molly Teem: Molly leads the SonShine Choir (gr. 1-5). They rehearse Sundays @ 9:45 am.
- Barbara Weed & Jenny Stone: These two wonderful ladies assist everyone in the office with all kinds of things. They also make sure the bulletin boards in the other building look wonderful. We couldn't get it all done without these folks. We are blessed to have them as a part of our team!



Educational Ministry

Christian Fellowship: The biblical word for fellowship is koinonia. It means a gathering together in Christian beliefs of fellow believers and our Lord; sharing with others our common beliefs and commitments to our Lord and Savior.

We see an example of this in the Last Supper. We also see an example of this when we gather together in Holy Communion.

Acts 2:42 is clear on the importance of fellowship; "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

Our fellowship groups, Bible Study groups and Sunday School classes are all ways we gather together. We gather together for meals and outings. We lift one another up, we encourage each other. Hebrews 10:24-24 tell us "²⁴And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

The friendships we make through our shared beliefs help in our everyday lives as we make decisions, as we witness to others and in our spiritual growth.

Sunday School is a great means to meet others and to create deep and lasting friendships. When Chip and I moved to Lexington in 2022, we knew one family.
