By-Law Updates

If adopted, effective date November 12, 2023: Youth Committee, section 6, page 17 add as item 11

There shall be a Youth Ministry Committee whose responsibility is to assist the Youth and Young Adult Director in planning and implementing programming for Club 345, (3rd-5th grades), Junior Youth (grades 6th-8th), Senior Youth (grades 9th-12th) & young adults. Youth and young adult activities may include, but not limited to, Youth Missions, Youth Week, seasonal retreats, adopt a college student, and young adult small group activities.

If adopted, these will take effect January 1, 2024:

Section 9: St. Peter's Endowment Board Membership & Responsibilities, page 19, item 1

Last sentence change: instead of "The Church Council of the Congregation" to be "The Stewardship and Finance Committee shall nominate two (2) persons for each seat expiring and the Church Council will approve each candidate to be elected at the Annual Congregational Meeting."

Section 10: St. Peter's Cemetery Endowment Board Membership & Responsibilities, page 21, item 1

The sentence beginning "Upon adoption of this resolution," will be changed to "Upon adoption of this resolution by the Congregation, Church Council will appoint seven (7) members to the Cemetery Endowment Board from a list provided by the Cemetery Committee:" and not use the words "from a slate of the cemetery committee." The next sentence beginning, "Thereafter...will now read "Thereafter, ...the Church Council will approve (not appoint) each candidate to be elected at the Annual Congregational Meeting to serve a term of five (5) years."

Page 22, Item 2: Last sentence stating "In the event of a vacancy on the Cemetery Endowment Board, the Church Council shall appoint" will change the rest of the sentence to read "a member to fill the vacancy until the next Annual Meeting of the Congregation, at which time the Congregation shall elect a member to fulfill the term of the vacancy." The words "from the slate of the cemetery committee, a member to fill the vacancy" will be deleted.

2024 Church Budget Information

The following notes highlight a few of the significant items in the budget (as seen on pages 5-6).

- 1. The church three-year insurance policy was due for renewal this past year. After reviewing the coverage and looking to insure the Sanctuary stained glass windows, it was decided to move the policy to Brotherhood Mutual. There is an increase in the premium but it provided better coverage for both the Church facilities and personnel. This resulted in an increase of \$6,179 for 2024.
- 2. The Cemetery Committee requested that the cemetery maintenance costs be moved to a budget item in the General Fund. This resulted in an increase of \$8,540 for 2024.
- 3. All Church employees were given a 4% raise in salary for 2024. The nursery workers were given a \$1 per hour raise rather than the 4%. This resulted in an increase in the budget of \$14,004.29.

Endowment Challenge for the Remainder of 2023!

As stated in the September Proclaimer, there are several ways to give to the Endowment Board at St. Peter's including just giving *any* amount on *any* day you choose simply by putting it in the offering plate and marking it **Endowment**. Ok, that sounds easy, so where's the challenge in that?

The Endowment Board is challenging each family to give \$20—just \$20 between now and the end of 2023 to see what a difference it will make. What's \$20? We spend that (or more) on lunch at our favorite restaurant. Grab an envelope from your box (or one from the pew), add your name, and write **Endowment** on the front. If, as our database shows, we really have over 400 families, and each family gives \$20 before the end of the year, we could add as much as \$8,000 to our Endowment Fund!

Snack Sack Ministry

This mission outreach program began at our church in the fall of the 2011 school year, so this will be the 13th school year! It began with Meadow Glen Elementary and we still deliver to them.

The program provides a "Snack Sack" of food for children on the weekends and holidays during the school year. Last year we fed 65 children each week and we are feeding **115** children this year. Some of these children may not get meals over the weekend without these food bags. We purchase the prepackaged food bags from Harvest Hope for a small fee.



Educational Ministry

Why Sunday School is Important

Katie Koob grew up in a Lutheran church; she was baptized as an infant, attended Sunday School & was confirmed. In 1979 she entered into the Foreign Services serving in Tehran as the director of the Iranian-American Society, a non-profit organized by the United States government to foster ties between the two countries. After only 4 months on the job, the American Embassy was taken over by Iranian students on November 4th and Katie was taken hostage. She was held captive for 444 days. Katie says it was her faith that sustained her. She put into her daily routine what she learned during Sunday School, confirmation, at home and in Bible study. Knowing who God is, memorized creeds and prayers got her through the 15 month long captivity.

While most of us will never face this type of difficulty, life will bring us difficulties, pain and heartache. What, or more importantly, *who* will you rely on to get through difficult times? Who will those we love rely on to get them through tough times? Through Sunday School, we learn who God is; by the things He has done, and most importantly, by sending his Son Jesus. All of this we learn through School and Bible Study.

Adult Sunday School Classes span all ages & life stages. Here's the current list:

- *Rufuge* is made up of young married couples with small children. Pastor Cassie teaches this group in the Gathering Room at 10 am on Sunday mornings.
- **Bible Busters** class members are typically (but not always) married and have kids ranging from upper elementary to college. Busters meet in room 210.
- **Joyful Believers** couples typically have grown children and are entering the "check out this picture of my grandchild" phase of life. They meet in room 209.
- **Seekers** group covers all adult ages and study various topics. They are taught by Larry James and they meet in the Fellowship Hall.
- *Adult One* Sunday School class is led by Bible expert Nancy Wylie and is open to all ages. They meet in room 202.
