ARCHIVES organizes & preserves the history of the congregation.

BUS & VAN COMMITTEE maintains the church vehicles.

CEMETERY is charged with the administration & upkeep of the church cemetery.

EDUCATIONAL MINISTRY plans Sunday School & Vacation Bible School.

EVANGELISM COMMITTEE reaches out to newcomers in our community & invites them to become active in the life & ministries of the church.

HOMECOMING plans the annual celebration which takes place the 1st Sunday in May.

KITCHEN oversees use & maintenance of the PLC and Fellowship Hall kitchens.

PROPERTY & GROUNDS COMMITTEE maintains the physical structures and operation of all church property and grounds.

SAFETY MINISTRY plans & implements safety procedures for the congregation in the event of severe weather, fire, or other safety related emergencies. They are also available to assist with safety for church-wide events.




