Thoughts from Pastor Cassie

Here in our community, we will have just barely started August & the school year will already be beginning. The fastest summer ever flew right by us. It was full of good ministry & a lot of fun; praise be to God!

For little ones, one of the best things about going to school is when it's your turn to be the line leader. Sometimes teachers will draw popsicles sticks out of a cup. When your name is drawn, it's simply the best day ever. You get to be the teacher's helper during morning circle time. You get to help pass out the crayons. You're the first one to pick out your hot lunch and chocolate milk. What joy!

Being the line leader adds some fun to something that is so helpful for teachers who are trying to safely get their little ducks from one place to the next. If I follow the person in front of me, I know where to go, & I'm safe...as long as the line leader does the right thing.

Toward the end of one of the most well-known passages of scripture, we have the word "follow". In our English translations, it fits nicely & brings comfort, but in its original language of Hebrew, it's a word that brings a great depth of love like no other.

"Surely goodness & mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, & I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever." ~ Psalm 23:6 ESV

I came across a quote from theologian Chad Bird on God's goodness & mercy. I shared it with at least three people. It's so good.

Chad Bird writes, "The goodness & mercy of God PURSUE us all the days of our lives. They do not merely 'follow' us, but radaf (($\neg \neg$ - the Hebrew verb for 'chase down or pursue'. Chased by mercy, hounded by goodness, pursed by the love of Jesus, we enter & dwell in the Father's house as his beloved lambs, part of the fold for which Christ laid down his life (John 10:11)."

How comforting it is to ponder how God's goodness & mercy follow us. The Psalmist reassures us that God's love is always there with us, right in step with us, wherever you go. How intriguing is it, though, to consider how God seeks us out, how God never tires of showing up for us & leading us with His great love?

When you send your little ones off to school (even if they're taller than you now), pray for them. Kiss their faces & tell them how much Jesus loves them. And don't worry. God's love is pursing them wherever they go.

Book Club for August

The Moonstone by Wilkie Collins

Rachel Verinder, a young English woman, inherits a large Indian diamond on her 18th birthday. It is a legacy from her uncle, a corrupt British army officer who served in India. The diamond is of great religious significance and extremely valuable, & three Hindu priests have dedicated their lives to recovering it. The story incorporates elements of the legendary origins of the Hope Diamond (or perhaps the Orloff Diamond or the Koh-i-Noor).

Rachel's 18th birthday is celebrated with a large party at which the guests include her cousin Franklin Blake. She wears the Moonstone on her dress that evening for all to see, including some Indian jugglers who have called at the house.

Later that night the diamond is stolen from Rachel's bedroom, and a period of turmoil, unhappiness, misunderstandings, & ill luck ensues. Told by a series of narratives from some of the main characters, the complex plot traces the subsequent efforts to explain the theft, identify the thief, trace the stone, and recover it.


Do you ever wonder what happens to all of the money we collect for school supplies? Well, here's this year's list of what was purchased or donated.

We purchase the prepackaged food bags from Harvest Hope for a small fee.


