So, you sing in the shower and think you might like to share that talent with the congregation. Here's what you need to know.

- * HOW TO JOIN: * Auditions are stressful & strenuous. Just kidding—THERE IS NO AUDITION.
 - * Reading music is helpful, but not required.
 - * All you have to do it SHOW UP for rehearsal and you're IN!
 - * We'll find you a robe and a folder & get you set up immediately.
- ★ MATINS CHOIR: Leads worship at the 8:30 am worship service each week. They meet on Monday nights from 6:30-7:15 pm. Craig Davis is the director of this group. Once a month we end practice early and celebrate the birthdays for that month. It's a great time for food and fellowship.
- ★ CHANCEL CHOIR: Leads worship at the 11 am worship service each week. They meet on Wednesday nights from 7-8 pm and on Sunday mornings from 10:15 am until worship time. Barry Moore is the director of this group. This group occasionally meets at Barry's home for food & fellowship.
- ★ **COMBINED ACTIVITIES:** These two choirs join forces for special services throughout the year including Reformation, Christmas Eve, Palm Sunday, Holy Week, & Easter. We typically sing for both services on these high, holy days.
- * **CANTATA CHOIR** is open to both choirs *and* anyone else in the congregation that may not have time to commit to every Sunday, but wants to lend their talents for a season. The music is introduced in the fall and rehearsals begin after that on Wednesday evenings. Sectional rehearsals are held on Sunday afternoons during the month of November. Cantata is always on the 2nd Sunday in December @ 11 am and again @ 6 pm. Piano, organ, and strings provide the accompaniment. This year's date is December 14th.

Being a member of a choir is a great way to get to know people, learn some great music, and have some fun! If you have questions, call me. I play for both groups so I know the scoop.
