Why We Have Music in Worship

Martin Luther once said, "Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." In *Luther's Works*, he wrote, "I would certainly like to praise music with all my heart as the excellent gift of God which it is and to commend it to everyone." Luther would go on to describe music as a divine gift that appears throughout nature, but reaches perfection in humans.

Music was a cornerstone component of the Reformation. Luther understood that music was one of the Church's primary instruments, and that incorporating familiar hymn tunes, with language in the vernacular of a society where fewer people understood the Latin of the traditional Mass setting, was a unique and powerful tool to share the Word of God.

Nearly five centuries later, those convictions continue to shape the ministry here at St. Peter's where we have long valued the role of music in our traditional services. From our two choirs, the handbell choir, children's choirs, and instruments on special services, we are blessed to be able to have such a rich musical component to our worship services. Music in our church has many roles. Our highest task is, and will always be, to proclaim the message of Christ. We strive to add to the liturgy and enhance the scripture on Sundays to our congregation, guests, and community. But there are many other aspects of our music ministry—fellowship, performance, cake and ice cream each month, or simply a chance to slow down for an hour during the week and allow your ears and voice to turn your heart towards God. Rehearsals are a welcome pause from busy schedules, a time to laugh, pray, sing, and be in fellowship for God.

There is one thing—and one thing alone—that makes our music department so successful: the members of our choirs. Some members are new, some are seasoned and have been in the choir for years—even decades! Some are young and learning to sing in our children's choirs for the first time. Some read a little music, many do not read music at all—but all of us sing, & make a joyful chorus to the Lord.

So the question to you is—what are you doing out there in the pews? Whether you've sung in a choir for decades or only sing in the privacy of your car or shower, there is a place for you in our choir. We hear you out there on Sundays, answering the Psalms, singing the hymns, chanting the liturgy. Come to a rehearsal and find out!

Constitution Changes

We have a couple of things to update in our constitution. We will vote on these in our November 8th Congregational Meeting.

Under Membership

8.03 currently reads: "All applications for confirmed membership shall be submitted to and shall require the approval of the Church Council."

New wording: *All names for membership shall be presented to Church Council. At the recommendation of the Pastor(s), persons transferring into the membership of St. Peter's shall need the approval of the Church Council.*

Under Church Council

12.04 currently reads: "No two family members of the same household shall serve as voting members of the Church Council at the same time."

New wording: *No two immediate family members shall serve as voting members of the Church Council at the same time. Immediate family is understood to include spouses, parents, children, siblings, step-parents, step-children, and step-siblings.*



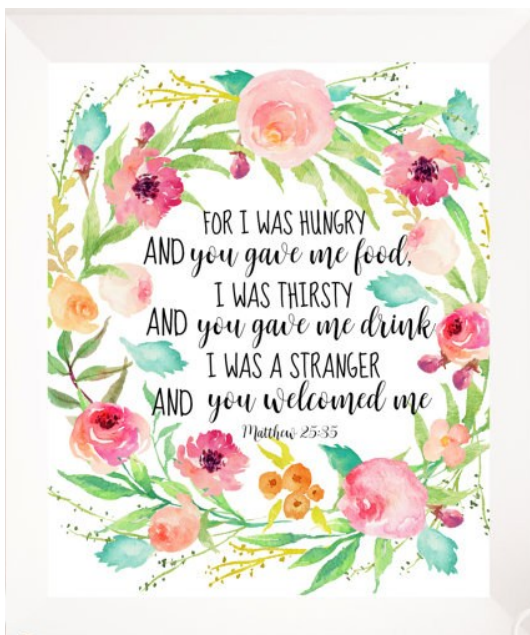


Snack Sack Ministry

This mission outreach program began at our church in the fall of the 2011 school year, so this will be the 16th school year! We began with Meadow Glen Elementary and we still deliver to them.

The program provides a “Snack Sack” of food for children on the weekends and holidays during the school year. Last year we prepared/delivered bags for 65 children each week & that number could increase this year. These children may not get meals over the weekend without these food bags. We purchase the prepackaged food bags from Harvest Hope for a small fee.

The children in need of the sacks are identified by school personnel and their identities are kept confidential. Our only mission is to purchase, pack, and deliver the sacks to the school. We have a devoted group of volunteers who are ready to pack the sacks and deliver them each week.

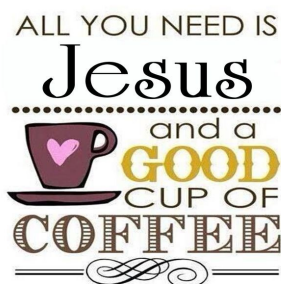

Cemetery Updates! Many years ago, St. Peter's was blessed to have a road paved from the cemetery gates down to the Gazebo. This road was paved in memory of John H. Harmon by his family. After Clayton Rawl entered into the Church Triumphant, his family decided to use the financial memorials to continue the original paving. St. Peter's was blessed to receive an additional anonymous gift in 2025 that allowed us to pave more than we originally anticipated. We now have a completed loop through our cemetery as well as a paved drive to the Scout Hut. Additionally, we had one of the Boy Scouts who repaired the Gazebo for us. Broken and warped boards were replaced, it was repainted, and now will continue to stand as a place of quiet respite for those visiting their loved ones. *So the Gazebo can continue to be a lovely place to gather, we will no longer be putting misplaced or faded flowers there, but will instead put them in the container at the front gate of the Cemetery.*

We are blessed that God continues to work through various people to help us be good stewards of the things He has entrusted to us. If you haven't driven the new road yet, please do so!

just happen to meet in the same building. And so we gather at 9:30 am every Sunday morning in the Parish Life Center to share a cup of coffee and perhaps a snack.

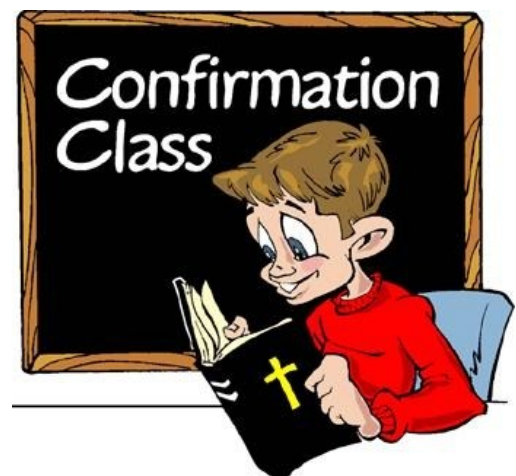

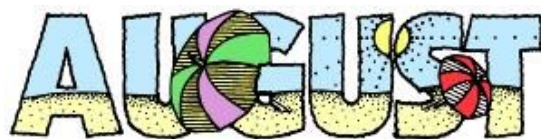

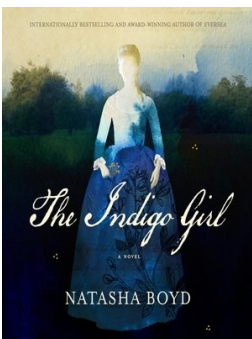

The Indigo Girl by Natasha Boyd is an historical fiction novel set in 1739, that tells the story of 16-year-old Eliza Lucas Pinckney. Left in charge of her family's three plantations while her father pursues military ambitions in Antigua, she faces financial ruin and societal constraints on women. Eliza discovers that indigo dye could save her family, and forms alliances with an aging horticulturalist, a married lawyer, and a slave, striking a daring deal to learn the secret process of indigo dye in exchange for teaching the slave to read—an act that defies the laws and norms of the time. The story explores her growth in confidence, resilience, and autonomy as she navigates the complex social and political landscape of colonial South Carolina.
