## Why go way over there? We could do that here!

That's a great question. Actually, that's a great way to look at things, especially when we think about sharing the Gospel and serving in the Church.

Acts 1:8 answer that question like this: *"Well, let's start here, but let's make sure we go there, too."* Luke records Jesus' words before He ascended into heaven: *"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."*

Most of the time we're "here", going about our normal daily routines, and doing ordinary things that God calls us to do. Then there are times when God calls us to go "there" to the place that is new and very different and perhaps unexpected. Sharing our witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ is a great thing to do, regardless of our physical location.

For the past several years we've taken our youth group on mission trips with an organization called YouthWorks. Those were awesome experiences that both challenged and inspired us. Yes, you can survive extreme humidity, sleeping on air mattresses, and road trips with buses full of teens blasting their favorite music. This year our youth mission trip will be with NALC Disaster Response to Perry, Florida.

Our many YouthWorks trips taught us that whatever you do while on mission over "there" you can also do "here". The deep needs for hope and practical help are just a part of the human experience. Going "there" helps us to see what we might overlook while we're "here". Our family in Christ grows through new connections made. We start to open our eyes more to see the image of God that has been sewn into our neighbors next door.

We haven't reached "the end of the earth" yet with our gospel reach. There is always more witnessing to do. The Gospel is worth it. While we serve in Perry this month, please pray for the people we'll meet, for opportunities to witness there, and for more chances to deepen our witness here.

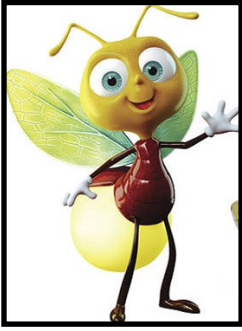

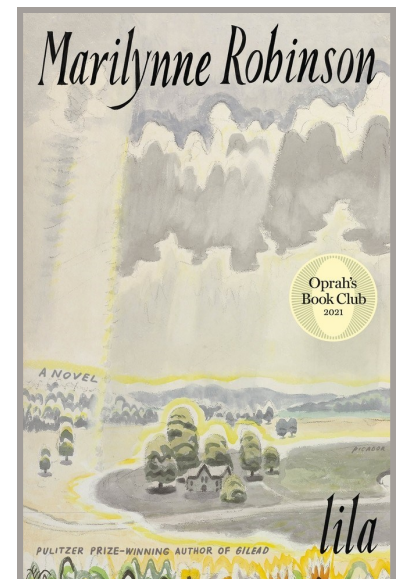
**Please Bring:** White thread, scissors, needles, pins, glue gun, & glue sticks
