This last week of September is Banned Books Week. Believe it or not, you have probably not only *read* some of these, but you may have a copy in your home as we speak. Here are a few you may not know are actually banned or almost so:

- ***Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*** by Mark Twain, 1884, banned as "trash suitable only for the slums" in 1885.
- ***Anne Frank: The Diary of a Young Girl*** was banned for passages that were considered "sexually offensive", and for the tragic nature of the book, which readers felt was a "real downer." (boo hoo)
- ***The Call of the Wild*** by Jack London, 1903, was banned in Yugoslavia and Italy for being "too radical".
- ***The Grapes of Wrath*** by John Steinbeck has been banned and challenged for "vulgar" language. Parents have also objected to "inappropriate sexual references."
- ***The Scarlet Letter*** by Nathaniel Hawthorne, 1850, was censored on the sexual grounds of the story line.

- ***The Great Gatsby*** by F. Scott Fitzgerald, 1925, was the tale of playboy Jay Gatsby & the target of his affection, Daisy Buchanan, and was "challenged" as recently as 1987, by Baptist College in Charleston, SC due to "language & sexual references in the book." (they should watch the movie—they'd go crazy)
- ***To Kill a Mockingbird*** by Harper Lee, 1960, has been frequently banned & challenged on both sexual and social grounds. (again-watch the movie)
