QUESTIONS FOR ENDOWMENT BOARD?

Join us Sunday, September 29th during Coffee Time in the PLC. We will have a booth set up & will be there to answer questions.

You may wonder—why should I also give to the SPLC Endowment Fund?

Give because a contribution to the Endowment Fund is an amazing gift that is never used up. Your gift is added to the balance of the fund, and the Fund grows. As the Fund grows, the annual distribution increases, enabling the ministries of the SPLC to increase. And far into the future, when we can't know what the appropriate ministries will be, the future church leaders will make decisions based on current needs, and your gift will be part of that future ministry. After other gifts have been expended, the Endowment Fund continues to provide a reminder of the faith & witness of its donors. That is reason to give.

The purpose of our Endowment is to provide continuing financial support for the ministries of SPLC in perpetuity. Ministries can include, but are not limited to, the funding of missions, capital additions & improvements, & special programs. Endowment distributions go to purposes that are not covered by the church's annual budget.

The annual Endowment distribution amount is determined by a formula designed to continually preserve the market value of the Fund. The investment policy and the distribution methodology, both part of the Policy, work together to ensure that the Fund will always be growing, even though distributions are made annually to support SPLC's ministries.


How can you give to the Endowment Fund? You can give a gift of any amount to the Endowment Fund today. Simply write a check and mark it for the Endowment Fund. If you like, your gift can be in honor or in memory of someone.

You may want to make a gift of appreciated securities. A gift of appreciated securities has added tax benefits because you do not have to pay the income tax on the capital gain that you would owe if you sold the stock. Call the church office to find out how to transfer the stock directly from your account to the Endowment Fund account.

You can also leave a gift to the Endowment Fund through your will. A gift from a lifetime of accumulated wealth may often be your largest single contribution. Your attorney can write an amendment to your will that includes a bequest to the SPLC Endowment Fund.





Education: Teach & Learn

The word "teach" occurs 105 times in 103 verses in the ESV Bible. The word "learn" occurs 43 times in 42 verses.

Titus 2:1 ~ But as for you, teach what accords with sound doctrine.

Psalm 119:7 ~ I will praise you with an upright heart, when I **learn** your righteous rules.

God wants us to both teach and learn. We have many opportunities to teach and to learn here at St. peter's. There are dedicated Sunday School and Bible Study teachers and we always are open to more help. Opportunities to learn abound. Did you know we have **six** Sunday School classes for adults in our attempt to reach everyone?

- **Refuge** is made up of young married couples with small children. Pastor Cassie teaches this group in the Gathering Room at 10 am on Sunday mornings.
- **Busters** class members are typically (but not always) married and have kids ranging from upper elementary to college age. Pastor Judson leads this group. They meet in room 210.
- **Joyful Believers** are typically couples with grown children and are entering the "check out this picture of my grandchild" phase of life. Spouse doesn't come to church or is otherwise detained during the SS hour? Not a problem. Several of their folks come alone. They are ready to start a new study called "The Bible Recap." Joyful Believers meet in room 209.
- The Seekers group covers all adult ages and study topics. They are taught by Larry James and they meet in the Fellowship Hall.
- Adult One Sunday School class is led by Bible expert Nancy Wylie and is open to all ages. They meet in room 202.
- Hallmarks of Lutheran Identity class is designed to assist in understanding the Lutheran Church's teachings in a nontechnical way. The class is discussion based and will guide us to learn the Christian tenets held by the Lutheran church based on Scripture alone. Chip Rhoads will be teaching this class. They meet in the Conference Room in the office building.

Our Sunday School also has classes for children from birth to 12th grade. Those who teach Sunday School have a love for children and want to help them build a strong foundation for their relationship with Jesus.

Wednesday Morning Bible Study meets, as the name implies, on Wednesday mornings at 10 am in the Fellowship Hall. Led by our Pasters, this group takes an in-depth look at different books of the Bible. There is a lot of discussion and good fellowship in this group. Free coffee.

Mustard Seeds gather for a light dinner and Bible study on Wednesday evening at 6 pm in the Fellowship Hall. They will begin Season 4 of **The Chosen** soon. Call Brenda Hedgecock if you have any questions.

Please take some time in your busy week learning more about our Lord. It is time well spent.
